### Who we served in 2020:



Information and Referrals were provided to 871 individuals. Access to financial assistance was provided to 4865 households. NICAO completed 660 VITA/EITC tax returns with a refund value of \$903,636.



of those served by NICAO 86% completed high school; 19% had some post secondary education; and 14% hold a college degree.



NICAO has 223 partnerships with organizations both public and private to expand resources and opportunities in order to achieve family and community outcomes.



274 community members participated in community revitalization and anti-



poverty initiatives. 1519 volunteer hours were donated to NICAO, 322 of those hours were donated by lowincome individuals.



#### **Emergency Services**

NICAO provided emergency services to 1824 individuals. Services provided included: emergency fuel or utility

payment, emergency rent or mortgage payment, emergency car or home repair, transportation, clothing, medical care or disaster relief.

#### **Agency Development**

NICAO employed 112 staff who attended 3276 hours of training during the year. 24 Board members also received 201 hours of training.





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### NICAO Outcomes in FY2020:

Early Head Start Served 16 children age 0-3 vrs. Head Start served 216 children age 3-5 yrs. Early Head Start Home





children demonstrated skills for school readiness; 89% demonstrated improved positive approaches to learning including improved attention skills; and 90% demonstrated improved emergent literacy skills.



395 individuals participated in Adult Development and Enrichment Programs: 75% improved their skills related to the adult role of parent/caregiver.

NICAO assisted 164 households with rent/mortage payments and provided 296 individuals with financial coaching/counseling

190 individuals served through Community Partners, FaDSS and HIV demonstrated improved mental and behavioral health and well being

> The Community Partners Program assisted 47 individuals to maintain an independent living situation.

NICAO provided 43 homes with home maintenance and or improvements. 4790 households received utility payment assistance to help with utility costs.

The NICAO I-Smile Program provided 1751 children with oral health screens, and offered dental sealants.

The NICAO Family Planning Program served 1158 clients providing 3207 visits in 2020.

1st Five, Head Start/EHS and EHS Home Visitation Programs used the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) to screen 940 children to measure their social and emotional development.

NICAO served 269 individuals in their Maternal Health



Program: 93% obtained a medical home; 81% of participants received an OB/GYN visit within their first trimester.

The Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program provided nutrition services to 4085 individuals monthly. Health Wellness

The Ryan White HIV program provided services to 40 individuals living with HIV.
